INAUGURATION REPORT

The Joint Commissioner (Acad.), KVS welcomed Sh. Avinash Dikshit, Commissioner, KVS and other officers and staff to the inaugural session of the Deputy Commissioners' Conference and hoped that the Conference will be productive and will give new direction to the organization.

Shri Avinash Dikshit Commissioner, KVS then addressed the Conference delivering his **Key Note** address on the occasion of the Annual Deputy Commissioners' Conference. Commissioner after welcoming the officers stressed that this annual event should chalk out a strategy and new initiative for the current year.

KVians had performed exceedingly well, both quantitatively and qualitatively in Board results. The pass percentage for Class XII was 97.39 with P.I. of 61.1. Commissioner gave credit to the teachers and students for the excellent result and hoped that the trend will be maintained. He further stated that the height we have achieved is commendable.

He further stated that KVS has completed 50 years. There is a need to plan for the future. Since there is no much difference between pass Percentage of 97% to 100% which KVS has already achieved, focus should be on quality of result. Therefore, we need to continue to strive and rise. We need to take care of the inhibiting factors, otherwise sky is the limit. We can not only make this a better organization but one of the best organizations.

Focusing on the challenges in KVS he stated that:

We need to focus on the quality of education as students need to do well in life. Therefore, we need to focus on the core activity i.e. class room transaction and need to be a facilitator, guide and philosopher to students.

As regards to infrastructure there is a need to pay special attention to the 250 schools which are presently in temporary building. We also need to pay special attention regarding maintenance of

the existing infrastructure. We need to use technology in schools and class rooms for better education, administration and guidance to overcome manpower shortage.

As regard the human resource of the organization, we need to make our work force happy. i.e. personal claims of employees are passed in time, there should be a time limit for settlement of all personal claims. We need to open up a dialogue with all stake holders so as to reduce grievances. This should be taken up on priority as the indicators are not good i.e. increasing court cases, outside pressure, medical claims not passed, leave not sectioned etc.

Joint Commissioner (Pers.) thanked the Commissioner, KVS and others who were present in the inaugural session.

The inauguration was followed by release of Newsletter of ZIET, Mysore by Commissioner, KVS. Thereafter, the Agenda Items were taken up for consideration/deliberation.

ACADEMICS

ACADEMICS

Item No 1: Result Analysis

Class XII

The Result Analysis was taken up with congratulations to all the Regions for producing excellent results in class XII for the year-2014. Following are the salient points of the result:

- The result is quite encouraging having a jump of +2.57 % and the results of all ROs have gone up this year.
- 03 Regions (Jammu/Varanasi/Jaipur) have shown remarkable jump in their results.
- Quality improvement is registered in all subjects in terms of PI.
- Pass percentage of all subjects increased except Mathematics and Economics.
- Girls' performance is better than boys.

Class X

The result of class X is not very encouraging; it has declined both in terms of Pass Percentage as well as the grades scored by the children, which is a cause of concern. Following are the salient points of the result:

- Pass Percentage of CBSE has increased but that of KVS decreased.
- Pass Percentage in all subjects has declined and it is more pronounced in Mathematics and Science.
- Percentage of students with 10 CGPA also decreased from 9.26 to 7.55.
- A1, A2, B1 and B2 grades have also shown downward trend.
- KVs with 100% pass percentage have also decreased except in Hyderabad, Mumbai and Patna Regions.

Class XI

- KVS average of Class XI is 77.94%
- Result of Ahmedabad and Tinsukia is above 85%

- Result of Lucknow, Kolkata & Jabalpur is very low as compared to KVS average.
- Commerce and Humanities streams' results are better than Science.
- Economics, Math, Business Studies, Geography, Accountancy & Physics need special attention.

Class IX:

- KVS average of Class IX slipped down by three times this year, compared to last year.
- Number of EIOP cases has increased significantly.
- This may be attributed to the change in CBSE promotion policy this year that the students must score at least 25% marks in SA1 and SA2 taken together.

Action Points:

Regional Offices must analyze the results of classes IX and XI of all the schools of their region. Appropriate remediation strategies should accordingly be implemented to augment the results. The following measures are suggested:

- Identification of weak areas / subjects of each school
- Identification of problem areas
- Rectification as per requirement
- Monitoring of effective syllabus coverage at school level
- Small and focused workshops for teachers as per need
- Periodic tests/segmental tests/cyclic tests for students along with teaching
- Use of Video lectures wherever necessary
- Improving the efficacy of CCE implementation in schools

Regions should identify schools of the region which have not performed up to the mark for the last three consecutive years and devise strategies for improvement. The Regional Offices must devote personal attention on these schools and adopt them and provide continuous guidance.

Item No 2: Conduct of SA1 and SA2 at Regional Level

- KVS to take up the matter with the CBSE regarding the conduct of PSA/OTBA for Classes IX and XI
 at the level of KVS and autonomy for the same needs to be worked out.
- SA1 for classes VI-VIII to be conducted at school level and SA2 for these classes to be conducted at Regional level. However, evaluation of SA2 is to be done at school level.
- In Classes VI to IX, one chance of improvement may be provided after SA1 also in order to strengthen learning of students.

Item No 3: Promotion of Science Education

- All the labs should be equipped with required equipment/apparatus and optimum use of all the labs, especially the Junior Science lab must be ensured.
- All the schools should be registered for Junior Science Olympiad (JSO) with IAPT in the month of July/August. Schools should also be registered with Homi Bhabha Centre for Science Education for Life Membership.
- Training of Science Teachers by Institutes such as IAPT, HBCSE, IISER etc must be explored by ZIETs by end of July and details must be submitted to KVS (HQ).
- All the schools should plan field trips of students to nearby Science Centers/Science
 Parks/planetarium/Central Labs/Science Museum etc.

Item No 4: Language Development Programs:

• The process of establishing language labs in schools is underway; meanwhile, good listening exercises should be planned with the existing equipment in schools. CBSE has directed English ASL activities to be conducted for classes IX and XI, but similar activities can be planned for all levels /classes to improve listening and speaking skills of the students.

- Public speaking in English and Hindishould be promoted by allotting one language period per week compulsorily for the same. Various activities like debates, declamations, role-playing, dialogue and JAM sessions, extempore speeches, storytelling and story completion, elocution etc should be undertaken to facilitate better speaking skills amongst students.
- The schools should ensure availability of age appropriate reading material in the libraries and reading habit should be developed in students.
- Creative writing should be promoted by organizing competitions and activities such as essay
 writing, poetry writing, and story writing etc. Spelling competitions should be conducted in the
 primary classes to encourage them to improve their vocabulary and spelling competency.
- Mr. E.T. Arasu, Director ZIET, Gwalior should send the material for promotion of English language skills prepared earlier in collaboration with EFLU to KVS Headquarters for further necessary action.
- The Deputy Commissioner, KVS Hyderabad Region should co-ordinate with EFLU for working out modalities of training programmes for English language teachers.

Item No 5: Introduction of PSA & OTBA in classes VI-VIII

- It has been decided to introduce PSA in lower classes from VI-VIII. The modalities for the same were also discussed.
- This year, for the session 2014-15, the question papers for PSA will be designed at National level by a National level Committee.
- The syllabus will be covering English, Math, Science and Social Science subjects and the question paper will be designed keeping the expected level of learning of the child in the classes concerned.

OTBA has been introduced by CBSE in the previous session in classes IX and XI in some of the subjects. It has been decided to conduct OTBA from this session of 2014-15 in lower classes i.e., VI-VIII in the subjects Science and Social Science as a part of SA2. The Content of OTBA for these Classes would be Class appropriate and would involve the case studies covered in the text books. The OTBA portion would be prepared at the Regional level along with the main question paper of SA2.

Item No 6: Environmental Education

It is decided to give impetus to Environment Education and sensitize all stakeholders regarding environment related issues. All the activities in schools should be centered on environmental concerns during this session. A detailed circular would be sent by KVS HQ.

Item No 7: Physical and Health Education

The Curriculum prescribed by NCERT and circulated by KVS needs to be followed in all the classes religiously.

Item No 8: EQUIP

The KVS launched this program in the year 2012 to promote excellence in the classes VI-VIII. The feedback reports from the various regions reveal that nothing much has been done in this field.

- The KVS (HQ) would again circulate the details of EQUIP.
- All the ROs have to in turn circulate among their schools and emphasize on its effective implementation.

Item No 9: Learners' Achievement Test (LAT)

- LAT to be conducted by Centre for Assessment Evaluation & Research (CAER), one of the empanelled agencies under CBSE as LAMPS (Learning Assessment and Measuring Progress of the Students).
- LAMPS to be administered for the classes IV,VII and IX. The modalities would be worked out by KVS (Hg) with CAER.

Item No 10: Strengthening of Co-scholastic Activities by Integrating With The Text Books

- All School/ZIET Libraries need to ensure the subscription of NCERT/CBSE publications and Teacher's Resource books.
- The Referencer prepared for linking the CBSE manuals with the content of the text books of various Classes would be circulated by KVS (HQ). This must be circulated among all the KVs for facilitating the planning of Class activities by teachers

Item No 11: Redistribution of Periods in The School Time Table

The new time table will remain as 08 period time table for all classes. The proposed changes were discussed. The finalized time table would be circulated by KVS (HQ) at the earliest.

Item No 12: Teaching by Principals, Vice-Principals And HM

The teaching by Principals/Vice-Principals/HMs can inspire teachers and serves as role model. It also connects them to students to know their problems and aspirations and therefore serves as feedback mechanism for improvement of the overall academic environment of the school.

• The no. of periods of Principals, Vice-Principals and HMs would be reviewed by KVS (HQ)

with a realistic perspective.

It should be ensured by the Regional Heads that these periods are actually engaged by the

Principals/Vice-Principals/HMs.

Item No 13: Staff Strength Fixation

The delays/ambiguities in the submission/transmission of information/proposals need to be

avoided by the Regional offices.

Item No 14: Support Material Production and Distribution

KVS Support Materials (Study Materials) prepared by ROs/ZIETs for various subjects for the

classes IX to XII plays vital role in the success of students.

Support materials (Study Materials) needs to be reviewed at Regional level before being

distributed to students of classes IX to XII.

Item No 15: KVS National Science Exhibition

The venue for the KVS National Science Exhibition was decided to be in Jammu region for the year

2015 with the directions to prepare the modalities for its smooth conduct and grand success.

Item No 16: National Children Science Congress

The venue for KVS National Children Science Congress is decided as Mumbai region for the year

2014.

Item No 17: National Integration Camp

It was decided to conduct the National Integration Camp at Tejpur under Tinsukia region for the year 2014. The Deputy Commissioner, KVS (RO), Tinsukia is to explore all the feasibilities like transportation of children/staff, availabilities of basic requirements for the camp etc. The same is required to be intimated at the earliest with specific recommendations to KVS (HQ) for further decision.

Item No 18: Basic Amenities

Instructions regarding provision of basic amenities have been issued from time to time by KVS (HQ). In spite of regular and repeated reminders, the same has not been attended to with the required seriousness. The following needs the attention of all the Regional Heads.

- Potable Drinking Water needs to be ensured in all KVs.
- Safe and hygienic toilets are the basic priority and need continuous and effective monitoring.
- Fire Safety Equipment along with Fire Safety Certificate from the fire safety departments needs to ensured.
- If the fire safety certificates are not issued by the departments concerned, the same needs to be pursued repeatedly with higher authorities of the State Government.
- Provision of Periodic Mock Drills in liaison with fire safety departments also needs to be initiated in the regions where it has not been done, which may ensure the safe exit of the children in the event of fire break.
- Barrier Free Access needs to be ensured.

Item No 19: Annual Academic Supervision of the Kendriya Vidyalayas

• The circular issued recently regarding the Annual Academic Supervision needs to be followed in its letter and spirit.

- The schools need to be supervised in a time-bound manner to facilitate diagnosis of the functioning of schools and remediation required.
- The performa D needs to be sent to KVS (HQ) regularly.
- Class-room teaching of Contractual Teachers also should be supervised by the inspecting team.

Item No 20: Library Automation Policy

- All the Regional Heads have to ensure the complete automation of the KV libraries in their jurisdiction.
- Provision of e-library needs to be explored wherein large no of e-books are available.

KVS(HQ) a copy may be endorsed to the employee concerned invariably.

Action by: All Dy. Commissioners.

Head of the office / DDO should also ensure that the officials who got "NO DUES" of HBA from KVS (Hqrs) may complete the formalities of Re-conveyance Deed, if, they have submitted Mortgage Deed at the time of sanction of HBA.

The Deputy Commissioners were asked to take steps to ensure the finalization of the disciplinary cases within a stipulated time.

2. Instructions of CVC on the order issued in Disciplinary matters by the Disciplinary Authority

Central Vigilance Commission has observed that the orders issued in the disciplinary matters by the disciplinary authorities concerned are sometimes not in the form of a speaking and reasoned order indicating due application of mind. The Commission had, therefore, advised need for self-contained speaking and reasoned order to be issued by the authorities exercising disciplinary powers with due application of mind. The Commission has also emphasized that name and designation of competent disciplinary Authority should be clearly indicated in such speaking and resoned orders. All Deputy Commissioners are requested to ensure and adhere to the said instructions of the Commission strictly in future.

FINANCE

FINANCE

1 Adoption of New Accounting Formats and Preparation of Annual Accounts of 2013-14:

The Annual Accounts of the Sangathan is being carried out at three levels namely School Level, RO Level & HQs level. Consequent upon the introduction of accrual system of accounting, since 2002-2003, the Sangathan is preparing its accounts on the basis of Accrual System of accounting. The adoption of accrual system has resulted into re-grouping or reclassification of certain heads of accounts.

While auditing the Annual Accounts 2012-13 of KVS (HQ) the DGACR observed that Sangathan prepared separate individual accounts on accrual basis for School Fund, VVN, Provident Fund etc. thereby the true financial position of the Sangathan as a whole could not be viewed in one stroke. It was suggested to prepare Fund based accounting in a single format from the year 2013-14. MHRD also directed to switch over to the new format of Fund based accounting from 2013-14 onwards.

On the backdrop of the above direction, Sangathan switched over to the Fund based accounting format for preparation of annual accounts of 2013-14 to view the receipts & payments of all accounts in a single sheet. In anticipation of the task being a difficult one, Sangathan conducted as many as workshops for RO staff, still most of the Regions submitted incomplete, more particularly, incorrect accounts to KVSHQ except Jabalpur. One of the causes for submission of such incomplete accounts to KVSHQ is due to lack of enthusiasm shown on the subject by the Heads of the Regions. At last the consolidation work was completed in the new format and placed in the Finance Committee. However, the Finance Committee, KVS after perusal of accounts in its meeting held on 23.6.2014 directed to adhere the time schedule. It is also informed further in the Conference that all Deputy Commissioners should render their annual accounts of 2014-15 before 30th April, of the next year. On the demand made by the Deputy Commissioners to conduct workshops, it was decided to conduct 5 workshops for Dy. Commissioners, Assistants & UDCs in five zones in the current year 2014-15. Finance Officers of the nearest regions will organize and impart such Training Programme shortly in consultation with KVS (HQ) and to report its progress to Addl. Commissioner (Admn) by

31st August,2014. Officers of KVS (HQ) will also coordinate and take part personally in such workshops.

2. Maintenance of Ledger & preparation of Trial Balance

While checking the annual accounts consolidation for the year 2012-13 the DGACR officials pointed out that Sangathan and its subordinate units are not properly maintaining ledger accounts and preparing trial balance to verify the arithmetical accuracy of the accounts. It is further pointed out that preparation of ledger accounts and trial balance statement are mandatory for every units before preparation of their final accounts. Sangathan informed in its reply that the ledger accounts and trial balance are prepared by almost all the units and instructions to prepare such documents have also been issued to the defaulting units and on the basis of the said reply the issue got settled by the DGACR Audit. The Dy Commissioners of all regions are requested to ensure that the ledger accounts and trial balance are maintained by all units under their jurisdiction. Addl. Commissioner (Admn) intervened and suggested to all Dy. Commissioners to carry out random check on the accounts & payment vouchers.

3. Audit on the Accounts of Vidyalayas/ROs/HQs

Inspection on the accounts of the Vidyalayas is carried out by the Regional Office/Headquarters. C&AG authorities are conducting Audit on the accounts of KVS HQs and State AG carry out audit of RO and Vidyalaya accounts. C&AG officials pointed out through their management letter that there is no mechanism to monitor audit objections in the Sangathan. Keeping the above observations in mind KVSHQ issued instructions to constitute a committee at the regional level to monitor the settlement of audit points brought in the Internal Audit & AG Audit Report. It was pointed out in the Conference that the Audit Adalat is one of the tool in which it is possible to review and settle all objections on the spot. For example: 148 objections out of 208 got settled in the Audit Adalat held in May 2014 in Bangalore in the presence of KVS(HQ) officers.

In the Conference, it was highlighted that Patna Region (547) and Chandigarh (468) have the highest number of objections pending for settlement by concerned RO. Addl. Commissioner (Admn)

insisted that Deputy Commissioners should involve themselves with the settlement of Audit reports. At the same time the Audit should ensure that there is no malafied intention involved while incurring expenditure by the Principals/DDOs/Indenting authority.

Dy. Commissioners of all regions are requested to scrutinize audit paras of both Internal Audit and AG on priority and furnish a report about the settlement of objections, pending paras with age wise analysis to Addl. Commissioner (Admn) by 25th August 2014

4. National Pension Scheme

Employees joined in the KVS from 1.01.2004 are covered under National Pension Scheme. As per the data available in UBI Portal more than 37000 employees are getting salary through UBI Web Portal of which 12268 employees are covered under National Pension Scheme. Gradually, the number may go up in comparison to the employees covered under GPF-cum-Pension Scheme.

As per the data available in this office Rs.26 crore is yet to be uploaded to NSDL web site towards legacy contribution. NSDL is uploading the deposits in every now and then and display the details of each account. Delay in making the deposits in the NSDL will affect the quantum of interest receivable by the employees. It is, therefore, suggested that the contribution towards NPS may be deposited in NSDL without any delay.

It was also discussed in the meeting to provide an application form to the employees at the time of his/her joining in the Sangathan so as to submit the filled up application form to the concerned K.V. for further submission to RO/NSDL. Dy.Commissioners may issue instructions in this regard to the Vidyalayas under their jurisdiction of the region.

5. <u>Issue of Provident Fund Statement to the employees</u>

It was reported to KVS (HQ) that the PF statements are not issued to the employees by few regions till date. The matter regarding the timely issue of Provident Fund Statement to the employees soon after the completion of Financial Year was discussed in the conference in detail and it was suggested that the DCs of the region should ensure that individual PF statements are issued promptly before 20th of April of the year.

6. Adoption of voucher format for receipts & payments

It is observed that most of the units are not adopting any prescribed voucher formats while making payment to the parties as well as to make entries for receipts and payments in the Cash Book. Invoice/bills obtained from the supplier/shops were pasted in a plain paper and filed in the Voucher File. KVS (HQ) designed the format which is being circulated/distributed in DC Conference for implementation. There was a doubt as to whether this format is required in addition to CS 41 proforma (check list) in-corporated in the Accounts Code. In this regard, it is clarified that the format designed by KVS may be adopted in addition to CS 41 proforma (check list)

7. Recovery of dues from the Project Authority

The issue regarding the recovery of accumulated dues from the Project was deliberated upon in the Conference in detail as the matter is alarming in such a proportion in as much as an amount of **Rs.43.33 crore** is due from the Project as on 31.03.2014. The following suggestions emerged out of the deliberation in the Conference.

- i) Make MOU as tripartite
- ii) Identify sick projects and to take specific action for closure of Vidyalayas.
- iii) The Dy. Commissioner of the concerned region may personally meet the Project Heads of both operative KVs/closed Vidyalayas to get the dues cleared at the earliest.

8. Functions of Drawing and Disbursing Officer's

The functions of DDOs are highlighted in brief in the conference.

- i) Incurring the expenditure within the delegated financial powers.
- ii) Maintaining the books of accounts.
- iii) Furnishing replies for the Audit paras
- iv) Complying the Audit Objections

9. Fee Collection through Bank

The DC (Finance) during conference apprised all of DCs/Directors about award of work of fee collection and investment of surplus funds to Union Bank of India (UBI). The Pilot Project is to be initiated from five Vidyalayas of Delhi Region from third quarter of current financial year 2014-15. The complete scheme and modalities of fee collection was deliberated at length including information format and MIS report format. The soft copies of format/report was forwarded to DCs through E Mail on 27th June, 2014 and their views was sought latest by 4th July, 2014.

WORKS

WORKS

Item No.1: To review the status position of transfer of land:

While initiating deliberations, Additional Commissioner (Admn), KVS appreciated the efforts made at regional level in finalizing transfer of title of land for some of the KVs in favour of Sangathan. He further emphasized that as on date in respect of 149 KVs transfer of title of land is still pending. Hence, a lot of efforts are required to be made to expedite various issues relating to transfer of land and to enable Sangathan to construct permanent school building for the Kendriya Vidyalayas functioning in the temporary buildings. Similarly in respect of 54 Kendriya Vidyalayas sanctioned in March 2014, concerted efforts should be taken by interacting with concerned Distt. Collector/Collectors to ascertain whether the State Govt. is serious about opening of Kendriya Vidyalaya by providing adequate suitable land as per KVS norms and in accordance with Additional Commissioner (Admn.) letter No. 110111/100/2007-KVS (HQ)/Works dated: 16.06.2014 addressed to all Deputy Commissioners, KVS, Regional Offices.

Deputy Commissioner, KVS (RO) Varanasi raised the issue regarding transfer of land for 29 years by the State Govt. which is against the guidelines of KVS. He was directed to meet higher authorities of Govt. of U.P. and submit comprehensive report to take further necessary action in this regard. Deputy Commissioner, KVS (RO) Bhubaneswar highlighted the urgency of construction of Boundary Wall to the Plot of KV No.6, Bhubaneswar. She was directed to submit the proposal with facts for approval.

Additional Commissioner (Admn.) directed that a mid way appraisal report on pending land transfer cases may be submitted to him at the earliest. Thereafter, Agenda items were taken up.

Executive Engineer (G) informed that Works Committee of KVS under the Chairmanship of Additional Secretary, SE&L, Ministry of HRD approved a budget of Rs. 406.00 Crore under Plan and a set a target of 50 school buildings to be sanctioned during the financial year 2014-15. In order to achieve the targets physical as well as financial, all Deputy Commissioners of Regional Offices must make extra

and concerted efforts for transfer of land by sponsoring authorities and submission of plans & estimates by construction agencies.

A) KVs where school buildings have been sanctioned on the undertaking given by State Administration but formal sanction of State Governments for transfer of land on permanent grant basis free of cost is awaited.

As per mandate given by the Board of Governors, KVS in its 79th meeting held on 26th June, 2008, KVS has sanctioned the work of construction of school building of 31 KVs on receipt of undertaking from state authorities. However, sanction orders for completion of Land transfer formalities in favour of KVS, allotment of land on permanent grant/free of cost is yet to be issued by state governments concerned. To protect KVS interest, Additional Commissioner (Admn.) further impressed upon the need to get expedite sanction order of State Govt. for transfer of land in favour of KVS either on lease/permanent grant basis and finalize the case of execution of lease/permanent grant basis without further delay.

B) KVs where land identified & planning action initiated awaiting lease/ undertaking from State Government for transfer of land on permanent grant basis free of cost.

Additional Commissioner (Admn.), KVS impressed upon all the Deputy Commissioners to expedite execution of lease deed/ sanction order for allotment of land/ submission of undertaking in respect of 104 KVs where plot of land identified by sponsoring agencies and accepted by KVS for the construction of school building/ staff quarters and planning action has also been initiated.

He further desired that Deputy Commissioners must ensure that advance possession of the land is delivered to the Principals of the KV concerned by demarcation of plot boundaries properly so that construction agency is in a position to carry out site survey and submit plans and estimates for the approval of the KVS and to save time.

C) KVs where land is yet to be identified:

Additional Commissioner (Admn.), KVS stressed the need of identification of land in respect of 45 KVs besides 54 KVs planned by KVS for opening during the current financial year on completion of

land transfer facilities. He directed that concerted efforts are required to be made at Regional Offices level by closely liaisoning with the sponsoring agencies to get the suitable plot of land identified and to complete land transfer formalities in favour of KVS.

Executive Engineer, KVS requested Deputy Commissioners that they must carry out the inspection of site personally, along with other team members and submit specific recommendation of site instead of simply forwarding it for acceptance by KVS. While recommending the site Deputy Commissioners must ensure that essential facilities required to run the Vidyalaya smoothly i.e. potable water supply lines, electricity, approach road etc. are available at site. The site must be free from encumbrances like old & dilapidated structure, HT/LT line and trees standing thereon etc. Further, the mode of transfer of land (i.e. either on lease basis or permanent grant basis) and location of the site i.e. Urban, Semi-Urban or Rural etc. should be specifically mentioned in the proforma devised and circulated by KVS and copy uploaded on KVS Website for submission of the feasibility report. Inspection of the site must invariably be carried out along with the Executive Engineer/Garrison Engineer of the construction agency so that various technical aspects relating to the construction of school building may be got examined properly and to avoid infructuous expenditure on developmental work at later stage.

Item No.2: <u>To review the status of school building targeted for completion during</u> 2014-15:

During the current financial year 2014-15, KVS has targeted to complete 20 school buildings including backlog of last year having progress. Additional Commissioner (Admn.), KVS directed Deputy Commissioners concerned to closely liaise with the respective construction agencies at their level and ensure the completion of the school buildings as money/funds have been remitted for most of the works and sufficient funds available under Plan to meet out the requirement for construction of buildings. They must also ensure submission of monthly progress reports with countersignature of Principal of concerned Vidyalayas.

Item No.3: To review special repair/strengthening of permanent school buildings.

(i) Monitoring of sanctioned repair works:

A consolidated list of special repair works, sanctioned by KVS(HQ) based on the recommendations of Deputy Commissioners of Regional Offices concerned during the year 2013-14 has been circulated on 23.06.2014 to all Regional Offices with the direction to closely liaise, monitor and interact with the Principals of the KVs/ construction agency concerned to ensure timely completion of sanctioned works.

(ii.) Annual repair & Maintenance:

a) Annual repair & maintenance of school building:

Executive Engineer, KVS emphasized the need to carry out A/R&M/O permanent school buildings at Vidyalaya level out of VVN regularly to avoid inconvenience to the students and staff. A/R & M/O is essential to minimize need of special repair. Hence Principals of KVs should be sensitized on the issue.

b) Annual repair & maintenance of Staff Quarters:

Executive Engineer, KVS reported that sanction order for allocation of grant to Regional Offices for carrying out A/R&M/O. Sanctioned for the year 2014-15 has been issued on 10.06.2014. Executive Engineer, KVS further requested all Deputy Commissioners to ensure that funds are utilized proportionately for all the quarters for civil & electrical works so that repair of all staff quarters is carried out and to minimize the problem to the residents/staff.

(iii.) Safety & Security:

Additional Commissioner (Admn.), KVS reiterated that number of times, Sangathan has issued directions to Regional Offices to ensure that all school buildings and staff quarters under the region must be got inspected by an officer of the rank of Executive Engineers/CPWD or State PWD in respect of KVs functioning in civil sector and by the Garrison Engineers/MES in respect of KVs functioning in

defence sector and obtain safety certificate for all KVs either functioning in project sector/ IHL /temporary buildings provided by Sponsoring Agencies or in the permanent school buildings constructed by KVS(HQ).

In respect of KVs running in unsafe accommodation, provided by the sponsoring agency IHL/project authorities, the matter must immediately be brought to the notice of the Chairman, VMC to arrange either alternate safe accommodation for functioning of KV or to undertake retrofitting works timely and certify the building safe. Similarly, in respect of KVs functioning in there own permanent school buildings, constructed by KVS, if found unsafe, it must be immediately brought to the notice of the KVS(HQ).

Additional Commissioner (Admn.), KVS has further impressed that no KV should be allowed to run in the buildings found unsafe. Similar action is also required to be taken for the residential accommodation

(iv) Settlement of account:

a) Special repairs of school buildings & Staff quarters etc.

Addl. Commissioner (Admn.) highlighted the issue of delay in taking up sanctioned construction and repair works and their successful completion. He has informed that in a number of KVs even after sanction of proposal by KVS (HQ), Monitoring Committee is not formed at Vidyalaya level to monitor the work. This ultimately results in: -

- (i) Delay in commencement of work;
- (ii) Slow pace at progress after start;
- (ii) Delay in remittance of funds;
- (i) Poor quality of construction;
- (v) Number of works remain unattended:
- (v) Delay in rectification of construction defects; and
- (v) Defects warranty period lapsed un-observed.

He further informed that exhaustive instructions have been issued by KVS (HQ) to all Regional Offices with the direction to ensure effective monitoring of construction and special repair works both at Regional Offices and School level effectively to avoid time and cost overrun and inconvenience to students and staff.

b) Annual repair & maintenance of staff quarters located in KVs for the year 2013-14:

Executive Engineer, KVS requested Deputy Commissioners to ensure that grants allocated by KVS(HQ) for A/R&M/O of staff quarters located in KVs for the year 2013-14 must be settled before grants for A/R & M/O staff quarters for the year 2014-15 is released to the KVs concerned to avoid duplicacy.

c) Annual repair & maintenance of staff quarters located in ROs/ZIETs during the year 2013-14:

Executive Engineer, KVS requested all Deputy Commissioners of Regional Offices & Directors of ZIETs to render the accounts of the grants of A/R&M/O staff quarters located in ROs/ZIETs sanctioned by KVS (HQ) for the year 2013-14.

Unspent balance, if any, along with completion report and financial expenditure statement, may be refunded to KVS (HQ) before A/R& M/O staff quarters is taken up.

राजभाषा नीति का कार्यान्वयन

दिनांक 24-27 जून 2014 तक उपायुक्तों की संगोष्ठी में राजभाषा नीति के संबंध में सहायक निदेशक (राजभाषा) द्वारा प्रमुख बिंदुओं पर प्रकाश डाला गया जिनका संक्षेप में उल्लेख इस प्रकार है:-

- क) राजभाषा विभाग, गृह मंत्रालय, भारत सरकार द्वारा जारी किए गए वर्ष 2014-15 के वर्षिक कार्यक्रम पर विस्तार से चर्चा की गई और प्रसंगाधीन विस्त वर्ष के लिए विभिन्न बिन्दुओं के संबंध में राजभाषा विभाग द्वारा निर्धारित लक्ष्यों पर प्रकाश डाला। साथ ही यह भी जानकारी दी गई कि कम्प्यूटर पर अब हिंदी प्रयोग के लिए यूनिकोड़ एनकॉडिंग का प्रयोग किया जाना आवश्यक है।
 - 2014-15 में हिंदी पत्राचार 'क' क्षेत्र के लिए 100% 'ख' क्षेत्र के लिए 90% और 'ग' क्षेत्र के लिए 55 % लक्ष्य निर्धारित है तथा सभी से आग्रह किया गया कि अपने अधीन क्षेत्रीय कार्यालय और केंद्रीय विद्यालयों में इस वर्ष के वर्षिक कार्याक्रम का अनुपालन सुनिश्चित करवाएं और वर्ष के अंत में मदवार रिपोर्ट भिजवाई जाए।
- ख) संसदीय राजभाषा समिति की प्रश्नावली में उल्लिखित विभिन्न बातों/मदों पर विशेष रूप से सभी संबंधित का ध्यान आकर्षित किया गया और आग्रह किया गया कि सभी कार्यालय मुख्यतः निम्न बिंदुओं पर विशेष रूप से ध्यान दें तकि संसदीय राजभाषा समिति के निरीक्षण के समय किसी प्रकार की कोई समस्या का सामना न करना पड़े:-
- 1. कर्मचारियों का प्रशिक्षण
- 2. कार्यालय को राजपत्र में अधिसूचित करवाना
- 3. कम्प्यूटरों में यूनिकोड़
- 4. रजिस्टरों व सेवा पंजिकाओं में हिंदी में प्रविष्टियाँ
- 5. पुस्तकों की खरीद पर 50 % राशि हिंदी पुस्तकों पर खर्च करना
- 6. नियमित रुप से प्रत्येक तिमाही में राजभाषा कार्यान्वयन समिति की बैठकें आयोजित करना
- 7. द्विभाषी प्रकाशन
- 8. अधीनस्थ विद्यालयों का राजभाषा संबंधी निरीक्षण करना
- 9. सभी मानक मसौंदे, फार्म द्विभाषी
- 10.विज्ञापनों में हिंदी व क्षेत्रीय आषा को प्राथमिकता
- 11.द्विभाषी वेबसाइट का होना

यह विशेष रूप से उल्लेखनीय है सभी कार्यालयों को न केवल अपने अपितु अधीन केंद्रीय विद्यालयों में उपर्युक्त प्रमुख बिंदुओं का निरंतर पालन करना चाहिए।

- ग) इसके अतिरिक्त राजभाषा नीति के संबंध में यह बात पुनः दोहराई गई कि कार्यालय में राजभाषा के उत्तरोतर प्रयोग को निरंतर प्रोत्साहन और प्ररेणा के द्वारा आगे बढ़ाया जाए। इसके लिए हिंदी कार्यशाला का आयोजन, राजभाषा विभाग द्वारा निर्धारित जाँच-बिन्दुओं का निर्धारण और उनका कड़ाई से पालन किया जाना चाहिए।
- घ) इसके अतिरिक्त यह भी दोहराया गया कि राजभाषा अधिनियम 1963 की धारा 3(3) एवं राजभाषा नियम 1976 के नियम 05 का किसी भी परिस्थिति में उल्लंघन न हो पाए। इसे संसदीय समिति द्वारा बहुत गंभीरता से लिया जाता है। इसके अलावा जो अधिकारी/कर्मचारी हिंदी में प्रवीण है उन्हें राजभाषा नियम 1976 के नियम 8(4) के अंतर्गत अपना शत-प्रतिशत कार्यालीन कार्य हिंदी में करने के लिए विनिर्दिष्ट किया जाए।
- इ) सभी उपायुक्तों को अपने अधीन विद्यालयों की हिंदी के प्रयोग की समेकित जानकारी भिजवाने के लिए मुख्यालय द्वारा तैयार किए गए प्रपत्र 'क' में समय पर जानकारी भिजवाने का अनुरोध किया गया । साथ में यह भी अनुरोध किया गया कि विद्यालयों से प्राप्त जानकारी के क्षेत्रीय कार्यालय के स्तर पर समीक्षा की जाए तकि विद्यालयों में राजभाषा के कार्यान्वयन की मोनिटरिंग की जा सके।

SUBJECT: - MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF KVS NATIONAL SPORTS CONTROL BOARD - 2014

The Annual Meeting of KVS National Sports Control Board - 2014 was held at India Habitat Centre, Lodhi Road, New Delhi on 24.06.2014 and the following members attended the meeting.

3. Review of decision regarding Under-14 Tournaments.

The decision to eliminate Under-14 age group events from 44th KVS National Sports Meet-2014 was taken in the last meeting. The decision was taken to avoid overcrowding at the National venues especially on the basis of experience of 43rd KVS National Sports Meet-2012 when nearly 10,000 Boys and 6,000 Girls reported at National Sports Meet at Lucknow and Mumbai respectively. However, subsequent to this decision various stake holders raised the issue and have approached KVS for inclusion of under-14 events. The Board may review and decide please.

The Board discussed the issue in detail and decided that it will not be feasible to restore U-14 age group tournaments in National Sports Meet.

4. 45th KVS National Sports Meet – 2015.

A detailed guidelines for conduct of 44th KVS National Sports Meet-2013 has been issued vide letter No.F.11035 5/ 01/ 2013/ KVS(HQ)/ Sports/ NSM-2013 dated 30.08.2013 (see Annexure – II). The suggestions if any for further improvement may please be discussed in the House, so that similar guidelines can be issued for 45th KVS National Sports Meet-2014.

The dates for 45th KVS National Sports Meet-2014 proposed by KVS, Ahmedabad Regions for Girls. The dates are from 14th to 18th October, 2014 and the same may be approved. From the table to above it may please be noted that only 47 proposals were found complete in all respects and approvals could be accorded after a lot of correspondence with the Regional Offices concerned. The discrepancies found in general were as under:

##

- 1. Estimates for construction were sent without required documents as prescribed in KVS(HQ) letter No. F.110357/01/2011-KVS(HQ)/Sports/dated 06.11.2012 (See Annexure VII).
- 2. Details of existing facilities were not provided.
- 3. Lay out plan of the Vidyalaya campus with proposed site is generally not provided by RO/KVs.
- 4. The recommendations of RO/DC concerned were not found in most of the cases, but instead the R.Os simply forwarded the proposals.
- 5. In a few cases a check on the kind of facility and number of such facilities already available in the Region was not made at RO level.

 In spite of returning a few proposals with above observations, the ROs kept on forwarding other proposals without proper scrutiny and adherence to the prescribed check list or instructions conveyed by KVS(HQ).

It is therefore earnestly requested that due attention may be paid at RO and KV level and check list may be followed strictly (specifically requirements as above) so that approval/sanction can be issued expeditiously. Further, Regional Offices are also requested to settle the accounts within the prescribed time limit as specified in Sanction Orders of the projects.

18. Major Sports Infrastructure Projects costing more than Rs.1.00 Crore.

KVS (HQ) has received a number of Major Sports Infrastructure development projects costing nearly Rs.1.00 Crore and above. Keeping in view, the nature of these major projects which include facilities like Indoor Stadium Swimming Pool, Fields with Astroturf etc., the matter was discussed in in-house meeting under the Chairmanship of the Addl. Commissioner (Acad.) and Executive Engineer (Works Branch, KVS(HQ) on 20.01.2014. The In-house committee has decided that such major projects will be considered, if accompanied by the following recommendations of the Deputy Commissioner of the region:

- 1. that there is a need for such a facility in his/her region.
- 2. that there will be optimum utilization of such major sports projects.
- 3. that the maintenance of the facility will also be ensured after the commissioning of the sports infrastructure development projects.

(Letter issued on 05.02.2014 – see Annexure - VIII)

- 2. Action Taken on decisions of the last meeting- Action taken report was presented before the house and it was stated that all the decisions of the last meeting held on 12.07.2013 were implemented, except the following two points-

Annual Report for the year 2013 – 14— The Annual Report of the year 2013-14 was presented before the house. It was stated that the KVS State BS&G conducted a number of programmes at various levels during year 2013-14. A detailed report was tabled before the house the details of which are given here below-

(I) State level :-

- a) All KVs registered / re-registered their Groups with the KVS State BS&G (except newly opened KVs).
- b) KVs/Groups of KVS BS&G organized training camps of Scouts/ Guides and Cubs/ Bulbuls for Pravesh/ Pratham Sopan/ Komal Pankh/Rajat Pankh/Pratham Charan/Dwitiya Charan etc at Vidyalaya level.
- c) Dwitiya / Tritiya Sopan Testing Camps for Scouts/ Guides were organised at District / Divisional levels. The Cubs/ bulbuls advancement programme and Utsav were also organised at District/Divisional level.
- d) Pre-Rajya Puraskar testing camp was conducted in every region to select Scouts/Guides, as per the quota allotted, to participate in the Zonal level Rajya Puraskar Testing Camp-2013. In all 1711 Scouts and 1439 Guides were recommended for the Rajya Puraskar Award-2013.
- e) KVS State BS&G conducted Trainers Meet at KV 39 GTC Varanasi on 29.10.2013 & 30.10.2013.
- f) Divisions of KVS State BS&G Organised Basic/ Advanced Training courses for SMs/GCs/CMs/FLs as per their need. The course wise detail is as mentioned below –

- b) The KVS State BS&G played host to a delegation of West Yorkshire, UK Scout Group. The Group visited Scouts & Guides Units at KV Sector 8, R.K. Puram, New Delhi.

(IV) Special Achievement:-

- a) On the occasion of Golden Jubilee year celebrations, the KVS State BS&G organised Golden Jubilee State Rally at K.V Gomti Nagar, Lucknow from 27.11.2013 to 30.11.2013 in which 800 Scouts and Guides and 165 Adult Leaders participated.
- b) KVS State BS&G Hyderabad Division collected and sent Rs.3,92,419/- in Prime Minister Relief Fund for Char Dham Victims of Uttarakhand.
- c) Dr (Mrs.) V. Vijayalakshmi, Joint Commissioner(Acad), KVS & State Commissioner(Guides) KVS State BS&G has been appointed as the Chief Commissioner (Guides), BS&G National Headquarters New Delhi.
- 3. **Election of the State Chief Commissioner & State Treasurer** As per the norms of BS&G, the election process to elect State Chief Commissioner & State Treasurer was conducted by Returning Officer Sh. Y. Arun Kumar, State Secretary, KVS State BS&G.
- (A) Dr Dinesh Kumar, State Commissioner (Scouts) & Additional Commissioner (Acad) proposed the Candidature of Shri Avinash Dikshit, Commissioner KVS for the post of State Chief Commissioner, Dr (Smt.) V.Vijayalakshmi, State Commissioner (Guides) & Joint Commissioner (Acad) seconded his name.
- Since no other nomination has been received by Returning Officer, thus Shri Avinash Dikshit, Commissioner, KVS has unanimously been declared elected by Returning Officer as State Chief Commissioner of KVS State BS&G.
- (B) Mrs Aruna Bhalla, Deputy Commissioner & Director, ZIET Chandigarh proposed the Candidature of Shri M.Arumugam, Joint Commissioner (Finance), KVS for the post of State Treasurer, Shri S.K.Verma, Deputy Commissioner, KVS RO Delhi, seconded his name.

 Since no other nomination has been received by Returning Officer, thus Shri M.Arumugam, Joint Commissioner, KVS has unanimously been declared elected by Returning Officer as State Treasurer of KVS State BS&G.
- 4. Zonal Level Cub Master / Flock Leader Basic & Advanced Courses It has been observed that Cub & Bulbul sections in KVS State have not progressed well. One main reason for this weakness is the lack of trainers. KVS does not have any trainer for these sections except one LT (C) who is due for retirement. Therefore, it was proposed and decided unanimously to conduct CM / FL Basic and Advanced courses at Zonal level and invite Officials from other States to conduct these courses.

5. KVS State Level HWB Course for Cub Master/Scout Master/Guide Captains/Flock Leaders

Till recently the Himalaya Wood Badge Courses were conducted by the Bharat Scouts and Guides, National Training Centre, Pachmarhi but now the decision has been taken in the National Executive Meeting of BS&G that if States are ready to conduct HWB course in their respective States, they may call for applications and seek permission from NTC to conduct the HWB Course in the State. In such cases the Leaders of the Courses will be deputed by the NTC and the rest of the officials will be from KVS State. Therefore, it was decided unanimously to conduct HWB Courses for all four sections during 2014-15 in KVS State. STCs will invite applications from different regions and verify the eligibility of candidates and there after STCs will assess the requirement of No. of HWB courses to be conducted and take initiative to organise them with the permission of NTC.

- 6. **Meeting of ASOCs** It is a matter of great concern that the required information, reports and registration money etc. do not reach the State Office in time. Since 2013-14, in every region, post of one ASOC (S) and one ASOC (G) has been sanctioned. These ASOCs are supposed to be LT / ALT /Pre-ALT in their respective sections. At least one of these ASOCs should have been attached to respective Regional Offices to look after the work related to Scouting. It has been noticed that there are discrepancies in filling up Rashtrapati Award Registration Forms and also regarding PM Shield work. Therefore, it was decided and approved by the house to conduct a meeting of ASOCs who are attached in Regional office in the month of August / September 2014 for two days to deal with these subjects and other related work. STC s / SOCs both wing may be deputed to conduct the course.
- 7. Starting of Cub Bulbul activities from Class II instead of Class III- Age to join as Cub Bulbul is 5 years. At present in KVS State, Cub-Bulbul activities are started when a student is in Class III (7-8 years), therefore, it was proposed that these activities may be started from Class II onwards, so that students will have sufficient time to complete the Golden Arrow award. The Proposal was accepted.
- 8. Participation in the National Jamboree and the Pre-Jamboree Rally-The XVII National Jamboree of the Bharat Scouts and Guides is scheduled to be held from 6th to 12th Nov 2014 at Jaipur. The National Jamboree is organized once in every four years. Though it is called National Jamboree, it is International in nature, because many Asia Pacific Countries participate in it. In the past these National Jamborees were inaugurated by the President or the Prime Minister of India / other higher Dignitaries. Thus, it is a very important and prestigious event. A quota of 280 Scouts, 280 Guides, 70 Escort Teachers, 02 Contingent Leaders and 02 Quarter Masters (Total 634) has been allotted to the KVS State for participation in the National Jamboree. Therefore, it was decided unanimously to conduct a Pre-Jamboree at KV No 1 Jaipur. The purpose of the Pre-

Jamboree is to prepare the Contingent of the KVS State for the competitions during the National Jamboree. A separate meeting of all concerned officials will be called to plan extensively for the Pre-Jamboree and National Jamboree. The Dy. Commissioner, KVS Jaipur Region was requested to make all necessary arrangements for the successful organization of the Pre-Jamboree and participation of KVS Contingent in the XVII National Jamboree.

- 9. **Expenditure for Divisional Rally, Pre-Jamboree & National Jamboree** All expenditure for the Divisional Rally should be borne by the RO concerned from their Divisional Association Fund. Expenditure for the Pre-Jamboree & the XVII National Jamboree should be borne initially by KVS (RO) Jaipur and later, be reimbursed from KVS (HQ) BS&G fund. The proposal was accepted
- 10. Track suits to all participants of Jamboree It was proposed that Track Suits, Shoes, Bag, Scarf & woggle, Pre-Jamboree Diary, ID Card etc be provided to all participants of Pre-Jamboree & National Jamboree. This would give the KVS Contingent a different and new look. The entire expenditure to procure track suits etc. initially would be borne by KVS RO, Jaipur (by following proper purchase procedure) and reimbursed from KVS State BS&G Fund, KVS HQs New Delhi after submission of bills. An amount of Rs. 1500=00 (Rs. One thousand five hundred only) per participant has been fixed for this purpose. The Proposal was accepted
- 11. Minimum requirement for Regional level Campsite / Equipment Store etc As per the decision taken in the last meeting held on 12.07.13, regarding setting up of Regional Campsite, many regions have responded and want to set up an equipment Store and Camp site in their region. Thus, SOCs / STCs have prepared a list of equipments that may be stored in the proposed camp sites. (Annexure-I). Annexure-I was accepted.
- 12. Approval of Bye Laws The KVS State BS&G has prepared its Bye Laws. A committee was formed to prepare these bye laws, under the Chairmanship of Dr. (Mrs.) V. Vijayalakshmi, Joint Comm. (Acad.) & State Commissioner (G). The committee, after careful deliberations, formed these bye laws. It was submitted before the house for approval. Members, after elaborate discussion, approved these Bye Laws and agreed to forward it to BS&G, NHQ for its approval, so that KVS State could adopt it. The Bye Laws of KVS State BS&G were approved by house to be sent to BS&G, NHQ for its approval.
- 13. State and Divisional Awards It was proposed to resume State Award in Scouting/Guiding. All members agreed to it. Thus, every year one state award in each section(S/G/C/B) would be given to eligible LTs/ALTs. The Award may be presented along with the KVS Incentive awards so that expenditure on organizing a separate function for State Awards may be curtailed.

Further, Many regions have not started giving Divisional Awards, thus, all Deputy Commissioners were requested to start giving Divisional Level award in scouting (one in each section — S/G/C/B) given to eligible LTs/ALTs/HWBs along with Regional Incentive Awards. It was also proposed to discontinue the District and Unit level Awards in Scouting as it is practically not feasible. State Level Award should be given only to a teacher who is an ALT and above & Divisional Level Award should be given only to teacher who is an HWB Parchment holder and above. A committee shall be formed to prepare the fresh Guidelines for the State Awards and Divisional Awards. The proposal was approved.

- 14. **CCL with DA in lieu of duty performed in Camps/Courses on Holidays** The matter was discussed but not accepted. Thus, either CCL or DA on duty only can be claimed.
- 15. Activity calendar for the year 2014-15 Scouting & Guiding activities are conducted throughout the year. Hence, an activity calendar for the year 2014-15 is prepared for proper implementation of scouting activities, so that individual progress of a Scout / Guide is not hampered. It is also necessary for the uniformity of programme in all regions of KVS. (Annexure-II). The activity Calendar was approved.
- 16. Any other points with the permission of the chair- With the permission of the Chair the following agenda points were taken up for discussion and decisions were arrived upon.
- (I) Two days Introductory Course in Scouting at NTC, Pachmarhi for Dy. Commissioners of all Regions: The proposal was mooted by Dr. (Mrs.) V. Vijayalakshmi, Joint Comm. (Acad.) & State Commissioner (G). The purpose of such course is to apprise all Dy. Commissioners about the working of Scouting Movement and activities of National Adventure Institute, Pachmarhi. The proposal was accepted,
- (II) Enhancement of Phone Allowance from Rs. 500/- to Rs. 1000/- to STCs & SOCs: Looking into the communication involved with all 25 regions of KVS, the phone allowance to STCs / SOCs was enhanced from Rs. 500=00 per month to Rs. 1000=00 per month and approved by the house.
